TWO CRIMINALS CRUCIFIED

Rome ruled with an iron fist. It would not tolerate criminal activities. Crucifixion was the means chosen to expose criminals to humiliation and pain.

³⁹ Then one of the criminals who were hanged blasphemed Him, saying, "If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us."

⁴⁰ But the other, answering, rebuked him, saying, "Do you not even fear God, seeing you are under the same condemnation?

⁴¹ And we indeed justly, for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong."

⁴² Then he said to Jesus, "Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom."

⁴³ And Jesus said to him, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."

Luke 23: 39-43

- 1. One of the criminals blasphemed the Lord Jesus
 - a) He mocked the Lord Jesus
 - b) He challenged the Lord to save Himself and extend help
- 2. The other criminal responded differently
 - a) He rebuked his friend
 - b) He asked the Lord to remember him
- 3. The Lord's word to him

That he would be with Him in paradise! What amazing grace and love!

PASTORAL LETTER



Dear Brethren,

A DEEPLY MOVING STORY OF LOVE FOR THE LORD JESUS John recorded one of the most moving expressions of love for the Lord Jesus. This came from a quiet and meek disciple named Mary.

¹Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead. ² There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him. ³ Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil. ⁴ But one of His disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, who would betray Him, said, ⁵ "Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" ⁶ This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it.

⁷ But Jesus said, "Let her alone; she has kept this for the day of My burial. ⁸ For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always."

John 12:1 – 8

1. Lazarus, Martha and Mary of Bethany

a. This was a family in the little town of Bethany loved by the Lord Jesus (John 11:5)

b. They hosted a supper for the Lord and His disciples

c. They wanted to express their gratitude to the Lord for raising Lazarus from the dead

- 2. Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard
 - a. The value of this spikenard would be at least a year's salary of a common labourer

b. She poured it out to anoint the feet of the Lord Jesus and wiped it with her hair!

c. Not everyone understood Mary's heart, Judas criticized her for it

d. The Lord Jesus understood her heart and lovingly defended her

- 3. Understanding Mary's gift to the Lord Jesus
 - Mary adored the Lord Jesus as her Teacher, she would sit at His feet to listen to Him (Cf. Luke 10:39)
 - b. She loved the Lord Jesus deeply and had prepared this for His death
 - c. This was her last act of love for the Lord before His death! No cost was too great!

Let us prepare our hearts to celebrate Easter this week with a heart of love for the Lord too!

THE PROBLEM OF LITTLE FAITH

²⁸ "So why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; 2⁹ and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not_[1]arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?

Matthew 6:28 – 30

But He said to them, "Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?" Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. Matthew 8:26

And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Matthew 14:31

- 1. An old problem
- 2. A prevalent problem
- 3. The problem of little faith is manifested in the following:
 - a. Worries
 - b. Fearfulness
 - c. Doubts

THE PROBLEM OF LITTLE FAITH RESURFACING AGAIN!

²² Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. ²³ And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. ²⁴ But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary.

²⁵ Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶ And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear.

²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid."

- 1. Context
 - a. This was just after the feeding of 5000 (Matthew 14:15-21)
 - b. The Lord Jesus sent His disciples on a boat to the other side
 - c. He withdrew to the mountains to pray
- 2. Caught in a storm
 - a. The boat was in the middle of the sea
 - b. They were caught in a storm
 - c. There were strong winds and the boat was tossed by the waves
- 3. The Lord Jesus walking towards them on the sea!
 - a. This was late into the night
 - b. It was the fourth watch (3 am to 6 am)
 - c. They saw the Lord Jesus and were troubled
- 4. The problem of fear
 - a. The disciples thought the Lord Jesus was a ghost!
 - b. They were afraid of ghosts!
 - c. The problem of fear overwhelmed their heart and minds!

THE ENCOURAGEMENT OF THE LORD JESUS

But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." Matthew 14:27

- 1. To be of good cheer (To have courage)
- 2. To know that it is the Lord Jesus "It is I"

His Person and Presence must dispel their fear!

3. To not be afraid

THE RESPONSE OF PETER

²⁸ And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water."
²⁹ So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus.
Matthew 14:28 – 29

- 1. He said to the Lord "If it is You, command me to come to You on the water"
- 2. The Lord Jesus replied "Come"
- 3. Peter got out of the boat and walked on water towards the Lord Jesus!

ADDRESSING THE PROBLEM OF LITTLE FAITH

³⁰ But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!"
³¹ And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"
Matthew 14:30 – 31

- 1. Peter saw the boisterous winds and was afraid!
- 2. When fear took over he began to sink!
- 3. He cried out to the Lord to save him
- 4. The Lord reached out and caught him
- 5. Addressing Peter's faith directly

"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

- a. While he believed in the Lord's word he experienced the power of God to enable him to walk on water!
- b. But his "little faith" dissipated when fear took over!
- c. He allowed doubt to get the better of him and stumbled!

THE MIGHTY PRESENCE OF THE LORD JESUS

³² And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.
³³ Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God."
Matthew 14:32 – 33

- 1. The wind ceased when the Lord Jesus got into the boat
- 2. The disciples saw this and worshipped Him
- 3. They declared that the Lord Jesus is truly the Son of God!

AN INSIGHT OF WHY THE DISCIPLES' FAITH HAVE NOT DEVELOPED

For they had not understood about the loaves, because their heart was hardened. Mark 6:52

¹⁷ But Jesus, being aware of it, said to them, "Why do you reason because you have no bread? Do you not yet perceive nor understand? Is your heart still hardened? ¹⁸ Having eyes, do you not see? And having ears, do you not hear? And do you not remember? ¹⁹ When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many baskets full of fragments did you take up?"

They said to Him, "Twelve."

²⁰ "Also, when I broke the seven for the four thousand, how many large baskets full of fragments did you take up?" And they said, "Seven."

 21 So He said to them, "How is it you do not understand?" Mark $8{:}20-21$

- 1. A lack of understanding
- 2. A hardened heart

GREAT CHALLENGES

- 1. To seek understanding
- 2. To not allow our hearts to be hardened
- 3. To be receptive and responsive to the word of the Lord taught
- 4. To apply God's word with faith in our hearts!
